<p>Greg Bear writes across genres, blending Science Fiction and paranormal elements and creating a compelling fast paced thriller.</p> <p>Robert McCammon, a writer from Alabama, offers melodramatic creations blending realistic events with the supernatural and underlying magic. McCammon writes from different points of view making each novel a different experience.</p> <p>John Saul is known for his Horror, Thriller and Suspense novels. The atmosphere he creates depends on the mounting tension of the story which pulls the reader into his world.</p> <p>V.C. (Virginia Cleo) Andrews writes shocking nightmarish tales in dark, fairy-tale like worlds. Frequently children are in danger in her novels and grotesque family secrets often play a role in the suspense and mystery.</p> <p>Daniel Hecht, an ex professional guitarist, writes in series as well as stand alone books that combine the excitement of the Mystery/Thriller with his interest in forensic science, neuroscience, and parapsychology.</p>	<p>Sarah Strohmeier's Bubbles Yablonsky Series features a hairdresser / reporter / sleuth from Lehigh, Pennsylvania. This series includes the use of neighborhoods, cast of quirky characters, romance, and sassy dialogue.</p> <p>Marne Davis Kellogg creates an older heroine in her Lilly Bennett series. Lilly is a U.S. Marshal in a Wyoming tourist town. She may be a 50-something but she still is outspoken, brash, and hilarious.</p> <p>Linda Barnes gives us Carlotta Carlyle—a Bostonian detective, ex-cop, ex-cab driver, and amateur blues guitarist thoroughly—competent but occasionally bumbling.</p> <p>Jan Burke writes the Irene Kelley Series in which Irene, a reporter who is a combination of Nancy Drew, Katherine Hepburn, Lois Lane and Lauren Bacall, wiggles her way into the middle of murder investigations.</p> <p>Meg Cabot writes hilarious mysteries in her Heather Wells Series. Heather who is an ex-pop star and not as thin as she used to be takes a job in a dorm where her residents frequently die.</p>	<p>For those fast paced page turners, for readers who like to gulp down chapters (like a good glass of ice tea on a hot day) try the following stand alone novels:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Harlan Coben's <i>Tell No One</i> • Douglass Kennedy's <i>The Big Picture</i> • Joseph Garber's <i>Vertical Run</i> <p>John Sandford writes in series and also in stand alone books. He writes hard-edged suspense/mysteries with strong language and violence.</p> <p>Greg Iles is an author with more finesse than Patterson and complex stores of suspense. There are frequent plot twists, alternating points of view, excitement and violence.</p> <p>Ridley Pearson writes detective series with serial murders and psychological implications. His novels typically are more densely written and thoughtful.</p> <p>Jeff Deaver's novels have series characters, psychological overtones, are set in a menacing atmosphere and often include forensic details.</p>
