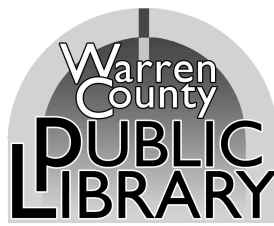


Stories from...

- *Library: The Unquiet History* by Matthew Battles, 027Batt
 - Traces the purpose of the library through out history and describes the impact libraries have had on history from ancient times to present.
- *The Librarian* by Larry Beinhart, Fic Beinhart
 - The Octavian Institute of plans for world domination when unsuspecting librarian David Golberg takes a job working with the special collection of Alan Carston Stowe the elderly magnate of the Institute. This is a strange and funny story of mystery and intrigue.
- *How the Irish Saved Civilization* by Thomas Cahill, 941.5 Cahi
 - An account of the pivotal role played by Irish monks in transcribing and preserving Classical civilization during the Dark Ages.
- *The Vanished Library* by Luciano Canfora, 026.932 C162v
 - This is a loving and anecdotal survey of the Library of Alexandria.
- *The Dewey Decimal System of Love* by Josephine Carr, Fic Carr
 - Ally Sheffield, a single librarian, is in love with the gorgeous married maestro Aleksis Kullio. Things are going well but something isn't quite right. Hilarious depictions of everyday life make the characters feel real.
- *The Thursday Next Series* by Jasper Fford, Fic Ffor
 - Thursday Next is a literary detective investigating different literary crimes: kidnapping characters, attacking original manuscripts etc. Thursday's mission is to preserve and protect literature. This is an unusual and original mystery that any avid reader will enjoy.
- *The Camel Bookmobile* by Masha Hamilton, Fic Hamilton
 - This novel follows Fiona Sweeny, a 36-year-old librarian, in her quest to make a difference in the world. Hamilton creates memorable characters and elemental emotions as she exposes the idea of Western imposed education and the villages' exposure to the Western World.
- *Aurora Teagarden Series* by Charlaune Harris, Fic Harris
 - Aurora is a librarian who frequently finds dead people. The novel follows Aurora as she balances her work, the new stress of solving murders, and her personal life.
- *The Librarian: Quest for the Spear* and *The Librarian: The Return to Solomon's Mines* DVD DRA Libr
 - These made for TV movies, starring Noah Wylie, is about a man who has never had a "real" job and takes a job as a librarian but finds out that his job requires more than expected.
- *The Time Traveler's Wife* by Audrey Niffenegger, Fic Niff
 - This is the remarkable love story of Henry DeTamble, a dashing, adventuresome librarian who travels involuntarily through time, and Clare Abshire, an artist whose life takes a natural sequential course.
- *The Mobile Library Series* by Ian Sansom, Myst Sansom
 - Israel Armstrong, a Londoner, finds himself in the middle of a mystery when he takes a job in a public library in Northern Ireland.
- *The Professor and the Madman* by Simon Winchester, 423 Winc
 - During the late 19th century the editors of the Oxford English Dictionary asked for entries for their dictionary. Dr. W.C. Minor, after having been incarcerated in a mental institution devoted the remainder of his life to creating entries for the OED.
